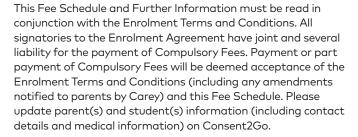


# 2025 Fee Schedule and Further Information

# International Students



### Intensive English Language Course

If recommended by the School, some students must complete an Intensive English Language Course. Reports from the Language School will be forwarded to Carey.

The School reserves the right to withdraw an offer if the progress reports from the Language School are not to the required standard as determined by Carey. In the event that a student has not made satisfactory progress at Language School and an offer is withdrawn, Tuition Fees will be refunded in full. The Application Fee and Enrolment Fee will not be refunded, nor transferred to another student.

If students are delayed arriving in Melbourne to begin their English language course, they are required to notify Carey as soon as possible as it may result in the withdrawal of the School's offer.

## **Local Support**

All International students under the age of 18 are required to have a parent, legal guardian or eligible relative to be nominated to take responsibility for the overseas students' accommodation, welfare and support in Australia. The parent, legal guardian or eligible relative must have an appropriate visa or have applied for Student Guardian visa (subclass 590).

Carey requires a parent, legal guardian or eligible relative to stay with the student during their whole schooling period at Carey. International students under 15 years old must live with a guardian visa holder or a local guardian approved by the DOHA.

For international students that cannot live with a parent, legal guardian or eligible relative approved by DOHA, Carey requires them to live in a accommodation approved by the school and nominate a local support person who acts on behalf of the parents for the duration of the studies at Carey.

#### Student Visa Program

A key aim of the ESOS Framework is maintaining the integrity of the student visa program. In conjunction with the Migration Act (1958), it establishes the bona fides of students travelling to Australia to study and ensures such students do not breach their visa conditions. It also provides standards for schools in respect of the offer of educational services.

Schools must be aware of their obligations under the Migration Act and the visa conditions imposed upon students. For more information, review the Department of Home Affairs (DOHA) website at <a href="www.immi.gov.au">www.immi.gov.au</a> and the information provided for schools and other providers of education for overseas students.

Students on an International Student Visa are required by DOHA to attend a minimum of 80% classes and achieve satisfactory academic results.

# The Educational Services for Overseas Students Framework (ESOS)

The ESOS Framework governs the education and training sector's provision of services to overseas students, covering:

- the Education Services for Overseas Students Act 2000 (the ESOS Act)
- the ESOS Act 2000 Regulations
- the Educational Services of Overseas Students Act (Registration Charges) 1997 (the ESOS Charges Act)
- the National Code of Practice for Registration Authorities and Providers of Education and Training to Overseas Students (the National Code)

## International Student Health Cover

All International Students are required by the DOHA to hold Overseas Student Health Cover for the duration of their visa. Carey arranges such cover before the students commence at their English Language School.

The indicative cost of compulsory Health Cover is \$AUD700\* per annum and is charged on you fee account. The cost is calculated on the basis that cover is provided for the duration of the visa.

## **Personal Spending**

Students find that approximately \$AUD50-\$AUD100 per week covers their spending needs for entertainment, transport and personal needs. This varies for each individual.

#### **Application Fees**

An Application Fee of \$200 is payable for each student's enrolment application at Carey. This fee is non-refundable and non-transferable. Applications can be made <u>online</u>, or contact the Admissions Office 9816 1242.

## **Enrolment Fees**

Following an offer of enrolment an Enrolment Fee of \$1800 is payable to confirm the enrolment. This fee is non-refundable and non-transferable.

### **Tuition Deposit**

A \$2000 Tuition Deposit is payable for entry into 3- and 4-year old Kindergarten, Preparatory, Year 5 and Year 7. For Preparatory, Year 5 and Year 7 entry, this deposit will be credited to your April school fee account in the nominated year of commencement. If the student does not commence at Carey in that year, this deposit is forfeited. Cancelled enrolments or deferred enrolments will forfeit this fee. This fee is non-refundable and non-transferable.

## **Compulsory Fees**

Compulsory Fees consist of the Tuition Fee, Consolidated Fee, Consolidated Fee (taxable supply), Digital Device rental and State Tax and Surcharges.

## Additional/Optional Charges

Additional/Optional Charges will depend on a student's involvement beyond the standard educational program. For example, additional music tuition, participation in rowing, selective trips and camps, sport jumpers, unreturned library books, etc.

#### **Additional Music Tuition**

#### Insurance

Vehicles parked in the School car park, and personal items brought onto the School's campuses are not covered by Carey insurance. Please ensure musical instruments and items of value are separately insured.

Student accident insurance is available for accidents which occur to students Australia wide. Please email <u>accounts.office@carey.com.au</u> if you require a claim form.

Student travel insurance is included in school fees for all school organised national and international excursions, camps and trips more than 100km away from the Kew campus. Please contact the Accounts Office if you require a copy of the Product Disclosure Statement (PDS) or a claim form.

## Student Temporary Leave of Absence

Where a period of temporary leave (between four weeks to one year) is required please apply to your Head of School.

## Withdrawal of a Student

As per your signed Enrolment Agreement, Parents must provide one term's written notice to the Admissions Office of the permanent withdrawal of a student. If the required notice is not received, a fee equivalent to one half of a term's fee is payable.
